DEXTER BOARD OF ALDERMEN REGULAR MEETING JULY 1, 2024

The regular meeting of the Dexter Board of Aldermen was held Monday, July 1, 2024, at the Municipal Building, 119 Vine Street, Dexter, Missouri.

At 7:00 p.m., Mayor Mark Snider called the meeting to order.

CITIZENS' INPUT

There was no citizens' input.

CITY AUDITOR'S REPORT

C.P.A. Eddie Cato presented the financial report for May 2024. The report showed the city had nearly \$9.7 million in cash and investments. In May receipts of \$956,093.34 exceeded disbursements of \$573,996.82 by \$382,096.52. Mr. Cato explained this was due to a transfer from Dexter Mo Public Facilities Authority loan to reimburse the water fund for the hotel project and the water meter project.

The May Sales Tax was \$145,275, Capital Improvement Tax and Park and Recreation Tax were \$81,280. The receipts for the month included sales and use taxes, grant income, and SRO reimbursement. The disbursements for the month included capital expenditures.

Fire Chief Don Seymore updated the Board on the volunteer work with the storm cleanup, the saw group finished on Saturday and the skid steer group has approximately 11 more addresses. The generator at City Hall has been installed, the LP tank will be installed next and then it will be ready for the generator company to do the initial setup.

Street & Sanitation Superintendent Jeremiah Robinson the paving has begun on the street grant, they have begun spraying for mosquitos, cleaning up from the recent flooding rains and storm cleanup continues.

Park & Recreation Superintendent Jamie Rowe reported they are continuing cleanup from the storms, Grille It Up will be held July 12-13, community garden program, swimming pool and gym expansion.

Water & Wastewater Superintendent Jim Overall reported they have been removing equipment from the Omega building and have had a few leak repairs.

Librarian Jordan Myers reported on the summer reading program, they have had approximately 2,600 books checked out and 1,100 e-books checked out.

Building & Grounds Leighton Hensley reported they have been keeping up with the mowing.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT REPORT

Economic Developer Alisha Trammell reported on her training with the Institute for Organizational Management and the hotel project. The farmers market will be held on July 3rd this week, a ribbon cutting will be held for Style Studio on July 9th and the Small Business Development Center will be hosting a seminar on July 23rd. She received certification for MoCED and has been elected to the state Economic Development Council. The tech center had 13 students offered jobs and graduated from the first program. Senator Jason Bean helped with securing \$1.1 million for the tech training center.

Other items discussed were how surrounding cities are managing nuisance properties. City Attorney Lawrence will research what abilities we have to get properties cleanup.
